

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I have to be a Chamber member to be in Women's Network?

Yes, to become a Women's Network member you must be employed by a Chamber member business or have an Associate membership with the Chamber.

Do I need to be a company representative to become a Women's Network Member?

No, any individual in a Chamber member business can become a member!

How much does a Women's Network membership cost each year?

It is \$70/year for main or secondary Chamber representatives and \$85/year for everyone else.

When are dues due?

Dues are sent out at the beginning of May each year, as the Women's Network fiscal year begins in July.

What's in it for me?

Aside from the endless networking possibilities, you'll be able to grow professionally and personally by attending our luncheons and other special events. Additionally, there are dozens of leadership opportunities available, which is a great way to cultivate life-long skills and boost your resume!

What is the time requirement?

Women's Network has a luncheon on the third Thursday of every month - drawing an average of 150 people - and you're always encouraged to attend. Joining a committee or attending other events is up to you. The more you get involved, the more you get out of your membership.

Are there any tools to help me get involved?

Similar to the Chamber's ROI program, there is another program called Experience Women's Network, or XWN, which encourages you to attend Women's Network events and committee meetings. The purpose is to help you become more familiar with all Women's Network has to offer, give you newsletter recognition and a certificate upon graduation, and help Women's Network excel by developing future leaders.
